On July 7, 2025, The Wayne Township Board of Supervisors met for their regular monthly meeting at 7:00 P.M. The meeting was held at the Country Crossroads Community Center, 3055 Ferguson Valley Road, McVeytown, PA. Members of the Board present were Ted Reed, Chuck Miles and Don Gearhart. In attendance representing Wayne Township were Mary Ellen Reed, Tax Collector; Jeff Hoover, Recreation Advisory Board Chairman. Several residents were also present.

Chairman Ted Reed called the meeting to order and led in the Pledge Allegiance to the Flag.

Ted made the motion to approve the minutes; Chuck seconded the motion; all in favor, motion carried.

Ted opened the floor for public comment on the agenda or other issues. Dan Walker, 240 Sechrist Road, Mc Veytown, made comment concerning the park benches that were unanimously voted on to be purchased 15 months ago and asked with what funds they were purchased. Rose Walker, 240 Sechrist Road, Mc Veytown, commented next about the park benches and that she thought she was told they were to be purchased by grant funds. Dwight Aurand, 594 Old 22 Road, Mc Veytown, commented on the condition of the roads, ditches and culverts and also made comment that the main job of the Township is to make sure the roads are safe and plowed in the winter.

Chuck made the motion to advertise Ordinance 2025-2 amending Septic Ordinance 2009-1; Don seconded the motion; all in favor, motion carried.

The sealed bids were opened for the 2025-2026 aggregate contract(s). The bids were as follows per ton delivered: 2RC - Hawbaker \$17.05, New Enterprise \$15.96, Morgan's Excavating \$15.00; AS2 - Hawbaker \$19.35, New Enterprise \$21.71, Morgan's Excavating \$20.15; Unwashed 2B - Hawbaker \$23.35, New Enterprise \$21.36, Morgan's \$20.00; 2A - Hawbaker \$17.10, New Enterprise \$17.21, Morgan's \$16.50; Cold Patch - Hawbaker \$137.35, New Enterprise \$168, Morgan's \$155; #4 - Hawbaker \$21.35, New Enterprise \$21.71, Morgan's \$20.50; R4 - Hawbaker \$22.35, New Enterprise \$24.71, Morgan's \$22; #3 - Hawbaker \$21.35, New Enterprise \$21.71, Morgan's \$20. Chuck made the motion to award the AS2 and Cold patch contract to G.O. Hawbaker and the 2RC, unwashed 2B, 2A, #4, R4, #3 contract to Morgan Excavating; Don seconded the motion; all in favor, motion carried.

The Board only received one bid for heating and diesel fuel. Don made the motion to award the heating fuel bid for \$2.613/gallon and the diesel fuel bid for \$2.797/gallon to Snedeker Energy; Chuck seconded the motion; all in favor, motion carried.

Don made the motion to pass Resolution 2025-10 approving application for the 2025 DCED Multimodal grant to repair and repave Little Greenbriar Road; Chuck seconded the motion; all in favor, motion carried.

The Board agreed to match 15% of the DCED Multimodal grant for approximately \$135,000.; Don made the motion; Chuck seconded the motion; all in favor, motion carried.

The Board was informed the Beaverdam Run Bridge Inspection Report is in the office for review.

The Board discussed getting estimates for a new storage building. It was mentioned by Chuck that currently there is little to no room anywhere to store anything and as the Recreation Board continues to have events more and more event decorations etc. will be accumulating and need a storage place. Ted mentioned that the office and maintenance shed is full and the "quilt room" is filling up. Some discussion ensued about what was all in the "quilt room". It was agreed that the quilting rack that is taking up a lot of space should be donated to someone or organization that could use it. Don went on to explain his position concerning the Recreation Board. Don claimed that it was never his intention to fund the Recreation Board out of the General Fund when the Recreation Board was initially set up. It was his opinion that the Rec Board was going to be self-sufficient and he was opposed to buying a storage building that was going to be used for the Rec Board. It was explained that it would store Township

things as well. Chuck made the motion to get storage building estimates; Ted seconded the motion; Don was opposed; motion carried.

Don made the motion to approve the Mifflin County Board of Appeals exoneration list; Chuck seconded the motion; all in favor, motion carried.

Ted gave the Water Department update. The CCR report is done and ready to view on our website and that the Lead Report has been mailed to the customers.

There was little to report on grant progress other than full funding has been acquired for the CDBG water meter project.

Jeff Hoover gave the Recreation Board update and briefly commented on the status of the upcoming Community Picnic July 19. All are invited for a day of fun and free food.

No public comment was made at the end of the meeting.

Don made the motion to pay the bills; Chuck seconded the motion; all in favor, motion carried.

Chuck made the motion to adjourn the meeting; Don seconded the motion; all in favor, motion carried. The meeting adjourned at 8:01 P.M.
