The article quoted him to say he plans on following in his Father and Grandfather's footsteps and I truly believe that that is a grand benchmark.

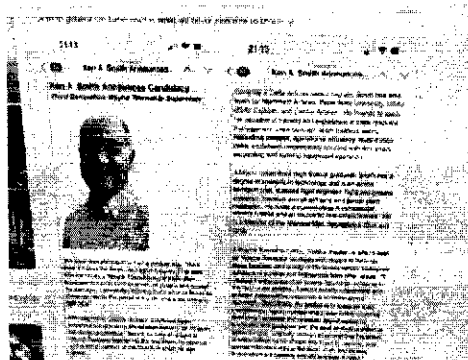
